Format

- Preliminary Rounds:
 - Teams will compete in four preliminary rounds.
 - Judging is based on averaged points for these rounds.
- Outrounds/Eliminations:
 - The top teams advance to the quarterfinals, judged by a single judge.





 Semifinals and Finals are judged by a panel of 3 judges in a win/loss format.
